#### **STEWARDSHIP & FATHER MARTY UPDATE**

The 2018-2019 Stewardship Program gives our students the opportunity to make a difference by reaching out to those in need throughout our community, state, country and even internationally. The many activities that the students will participate in are possible because of the direct involvement of our PTO and SMS parents. We hope to make this year's Stewardship program the greatest.

Fr. Marty, and the students enrolled in Our Lady of Nazareth Mission School in Nairobi, are extremely grateful for the generous donation made by the students of SMS. The donated money was collected throughout the past school year through monthly \$1 Dress Down Days. A check for over \$2,000 was mailed to Our Lady of Nazareth from this past school year. The Mission School is located in the middle of Nairobi's largest and worst slum named Mukuru, where 250,000 people struggle to survive. In Swahili, makuru means "garbage dump." The only way out of this disease filled and unsanitary area is through education. Thus, the importance of Our Lady of Nazareth School, that was founded by Fr. Marty, where over 1,800 children are enrolled! Our donation will make it possible to educate and feed over 100 children for a full year at Our Lady of Nazareth Primary School.

This school year we will continue to hold monthly \$1 Dress Down and Stewardship Days. The first dress down and Stewardship day will be held on Friday,

#### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

- School buses will be available on the first day of school. Information will be sent to you from Berea, Strongsville, and Olmsted Falls Transportation Departments. Please call the Transportation Department if you have any questions regarding your child's bus. Students may enter the classroom any time after 8:30am. Classes will begin with the 9:00am bell and will end at the 3:10pm bell. Dismissal will begin at 3:20pm. If you plan to drive your child to school, you must drop them off and pick them up in the playground area (parking area in rear of the building). Please observe parking lot procedures. Staff members will be posted at all doors to receive and dismiss your child every day. The area in the circle in front of the school is reserved for buses. Please do not enter or park in this area.
- If your child rides a bike to school, please remind him/her that the bike is to be <u>walked</u> on school grounds. It is your child's responsibility to lock the bike during the school day. The school will not be responsible for any damaged or stolen bike.
- Parents visiting the school during operating hours are to use a designated parking space in the rear parking lot. Remember, NO CARS are permitted to park in the fenced portion of the rear parking lot during school hours.
- o No motorbikes or skateboards are permitted on school property.

#### PARENTS AND VISITORS TO SMS

All parents and visitors entering the school building between the hours of **8:00am and 4:00pm MUST** enter through the north door labeled **SCHOOL ENTRANCE** adjacent to the side driveway. A **VISITOR'S PASS** will be issued. Persons with appointments after 4:00pm must enter through the Extended Care door (rear GYM ENTRANCE adjacent to the rear parking lot) and check in with the Day Care personnel. Also, please know our policy remains that no student may re-enter the school after 4:00pm to retrieve items from a classroom.

### **EMERGENCY/MEDICAL INFORMATION FORM**

An Emergency/Medical form will be sent home with your child on the first day of school. Parents are requested to <u>complete one form for each child and return it to the school the by</u> <u>August 31<sup>st</sup></u>. Please do not fold or staple this form, as copies will be made for the Extended Care, classroom teacher, and clinic.

### \*\*\*FIRST DAY FORMS

On the first day of school your child will bring home the 1) Emergency Medical form; 2) Permission to Walk to Church; 3) Parent/Student Handbook; 4) Acceptable Use Policy; 5) Chromebook Use Policy (Gr. 6-8); 6) Google Apps for Education 7) Cell Phone Policy 8) Back Pack Permission Policy (Gr. 6-8). These forms are on white paper, please complete, sign, and return these forms to the school the by August 31<sup>st</sup>. (Forms, also, available on website).

## **STUDENT MEDICATION**

#### WHEN IT IS NECESSARY FOR SCHOOL PERSONNEL TO ADMINISTER PRESCRIBED MEDICATION, THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES ARE TO BE FOLLOWED:

- All school personnel must be informed that the administration of any drug (prescription or over the counter) without the order of the physician and the permission of the patient/guardian could be interpreted as practicing medicine and is PROHIBITED by law.
- WRITTEN REQUEST must be obtained from the physician, and the parent/guardian, before any medication (prescription or over the counter) may be administered by school personnel. The request must include instructions as to the name of the medication, dosage, time and duration of the medication, and possible side effect. NOTE: A proper prescription bottle of medication DOES NOT take the place of the physician's written note with a signature giving permission to administer medication. All medications must have both a physician's written request and a parent's written request to administer medication.
- Medication must be in the ORIGINAL containers (child-proof) and have an affixed label including the student's name, name of the medication, dosage, route of administration, and the time of administration.
- The medication and the SIGNED permission forms must be brought to the school by the parent/guardian. (Forms are available in the school office, clinic, or can be printed from our website.)
- New request forms must be submitted each school year and as necessary for changes in medication order.

## SCHOOL SUPPLIES

A list of supplies students should have on a regular basis throughout the school year is posted on-line. All students will receive a <u>free</u> homework assignment notebook, a two-pocket folder, and book covers on the first day of school thanks to support from several local businesses. Students in <u>Grade 4 must purchase</u> a set of subject binders the first day of school (Grades 5-6-7-8 optional) – details are included on the Student Supply List. The cost for these binders is \$20.00. Checks made payable to SMS.

#### **PHYSICAL EDUCATION**

Gym classes will begin on the second day of school Thursday, August  $30^{h}$ . All students are expected to be dressed for class. The classroom teacher will let your child know when he/she will be scheduled for physical education. The students in Grades 1-8 will need tennis shoes, over the ankle white socks, SMS gym shorts, T-shirt, sweatshirt, and sweatpants. Please mark your child's name on the tag of gym uniform. Our Physical Education uniform dress code requires students to wear the gym uniform to school on gym days and remain in gym uniform throughout the entire day. Please refer to the Parent/Student handbook for complete dress code information.

#### 2018-2019 UNIFORM POLICY

All students are expected to be in School Uniform on the first day of school. The Uniform Policy is posted on-line and in the Parent/Students handbook. Reminder: new options are available for both the gym uniform and school uniform. Refer to the handbook for the specific information on this update.

The SMS School Uniform Policy for Grades 1 through 8 will be vigorously enforced from the first day of school through the last. Students must be in compliance with the Uniform Policy every day. Uniforms should be washed and pressed as needed. Students receiving three dress code violations in one semester will be issued a lunchtime detention. Do not\_purchase uniform clothing items or shoes unless you are positive they will be in compliance with the Uniform Policy. The change in the Uniform Policy for St. Mary Catholic School is as follows:

#### JUNIOR HIGH NEWS

Special dances will be held during the school year for the Junior High students. All students must be picked up at the school by their parents or an adult at the conclusion of each dance. These arrangements must be made in advance and indicated on the permission slip or the student cannot attend.

Also, Eighth Grade students will be receiving an invitation to attend High School Night. During this meeting, the local Catholic high schools will inform you of their curriculum and activities, and answer your questions. This evening is a perfect way to preview Catholic high schools as the search begins for where your child would like to apply. Additional information, dates, and locations will be forwarded to you as soon as it becomes available.

#### HONOR ROLL

We will utilize the Honor Roll for students in Grades 4 through 8 to provide encouragement to our students and honor their hard work and academic achievement.

Honor, Merit, and Achievement Awards will be announced quarterly. Certificates will be given and a list of students achieving Honor and Merit status will be posted in the main hallway.

#### PARENT/STUDENT HANDBOOK

The Parent/Student Handbook is available on-line. Parents will receive a "return and sign" form acknowledging that you and your child have reviewed and are aware of the school policies and procedures posted within the handbook. In addition, the teachers and principal in the classroom will review portions of the handbook.

#### **CAFETERIA/PLAYGROUND SUPERVISION**

Parents have the opportunity to volunteer in the cafeteria. Parent duty is from 11:50am until 1:10pm. Duties include wiping down tables after each lunch rotation, help students with food packages, keeping noise level at a minimum, and making sure not student leaves the cafeteria without permission. **Please contact office if you would like to volunteer.** 

Students will rotate between lunch and recess during this time. Parent volunteers will need to arrive PROMPTLY at 11:45am and remain till 1:10pm. This schedule will require inside and possible outside supervision during the lunch hour. The teachers and assistants will follow a rotating scheduled to be outside with students during the recess period.

#### HOT LUNCH PROGRAM & MILK TICKETS

The cafeteria will continue the same CASH procedure. Monthly menus are posted online. The amount for each item is listed on the menu. Simply send in the proper amount of cash each day with your child in Grades 1-8 to purchase a hot lunch or a la-carte item. Please be sure to look at the menus carefully as some of the prices have changed. The Kindergarten teachers will inform parents on lunchroom procedures, snacks, instructions for ordering milk, and participation in the hot lunch program.

MILK TICKETS will be sold on the FIRST FRIDAY OF EACH MONTH. The cost will be 20 tickets for \$5.00. A Milk Ticket Order Form will be sent home the first day of school and will be given on an as needed basis.

#### FRIDAY FAMILY EMAILS

SMS will continue to use a Friday Family Email for the 2018-2019 School Year. This program has streamlined communication between families and the school. On Friday you should expect to receive an email containing school and community correspondence that needs to be shared with families. The email will be <u>sent out at the end of the Friday school day</u>. This program has eliminated lost or misplaced forms, letters, and notices. Over the weekend, find time to review the contents of the Family Email and respond to anything that needs addressed. These responses or any concerns should be given to the child's homeroom teacher the following Monday.

#### VIDEO TAPING

Videotaping will occur at SMS for educational purposes. If you have any questions, please speak to the principal.

# **EXTENDED CARE & PRESCHOOL DAY CARE PROGRAM**

We will continue to provide before and after school care, providing children time for relaxation, snacks, physical activity, homework, or tutoring supervision when needed. The program is not an extension of the school day nor will it be an unstructured "baby-sitting" service. The hours will be 6:30-8:30am and 3:30-6:00pm on school days for students in Kindergarten through Grade 8. The Preschool Day Care is available every weekday between 6:30am and 6:00pm.

#### FAMILY VACATIONS

Your child's daily **attendance at school is VITAL** to their academic success. Please refer to your annual school calendar prior to making vacation plans.

Many times parents ask for schoolwork prior to leaving for a vacation, however, much of the instruction in class is done hands-on, in groups, with a partner, and one-on-one with a teacher. None of these activities can be replaced with a worksheet. Worksheets are used in class for practice and as a way for the teacher to assess if the student has mastered the concepts that have been taught. So when a parent asks for worksheets, the student is only getting a very small part of the learning process that takes place in the classroom.

If you take a vacation during the school year, the teacher will provide you with work when you **RETURN** from your trip. All work should be completed and returned within one week or as specified by the teacher. Your child may need to miss several recess periods so that the teacher can address what was missed during his/her absence. Remember - when your child misses a day, he/she misses a lot!!!
